

Read-Around Display

Make a read-around display about a book you have read.

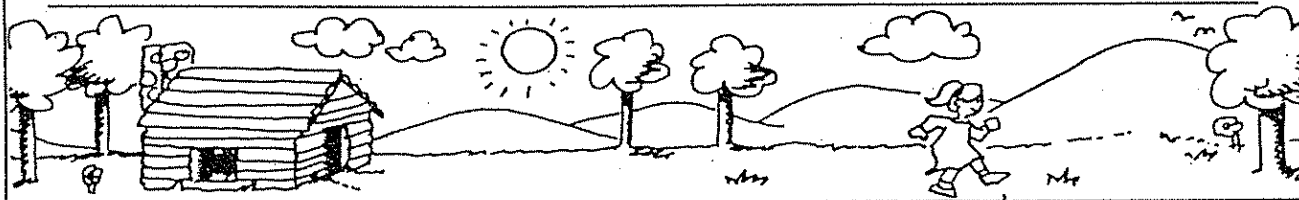
You need:

8" X 18" strip of light-colored construction paper
 crayons or markers
 string
 ruler
 tape or glue
 hole punch (if available)

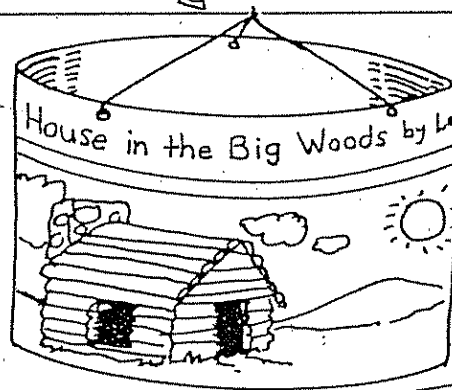
Directions:

1. Write the title and author across the top of the paper.
2. Draw two long writing lines across the width of the paper. Use the lines to write a description of your favorite part of the book.

3. Draw colorful scenes from the book along the bottom of the paper.
4. Bend the paper into a circle. Tape or glue the edges together. Cut three equal-length pieces of string. Punch three holes about the same distance apart near the top of the circle. Attach the pieces of string and tie at the top as shown.
